

Quick reference basic rules sharing study resources on internet

On websites such as Studeersnel and Stuvia, students can upload (upon payment) study material and share it publicly. There are risks involved here. It is, according to copyright law, not always allowed to publish or reproduce material from others without permission. Only the creator has the copyright. For this reason, we provide basic rules that you can use if you consider uploading study material.

Which uploads are permitted?

- your own notes
- your own summaries of textbooks. Structurally copying whole sentences is not allowed.

Which uploads are not permitted?

- (practise) exams
- other people's PowerPoints
- syllabi
- books
- articles
- lecture video recordings

Note: violation of the rules gives Zuyd the right to take measures, as you can read in the student charter.
